How to enter:

Write an essay:

Using between 500 and 750 words, answer the above prompt to demonstrate a thorough understanding of the topic. Essays should be typed. Attach to the front of the essay a separate sheet of paper with your name, address, telephone number, parent or guardian's name and name of your school. Essays will be judged for creativity, accuracy, clarity, technical soundness (grammar, punctuation, etc.) and the level of independent research. Essays should be emailed directly to kbaldus@co-mo.coop or submitted by your teacher.

Rules and Regulations

- All entries must be received by March 22, 2024. No late projects will be judged.
- All projects must be submitted by your teacher or sent by you to kbaldus@co-mo. coop.
- All high school sophomores currently residing in or attending school in Co-Mo's service area and who will be living in Co-Mo's service area at the time of the trip who are not children or grandchildren of a current Co-Mo board member or employee are eligible.
- All submissions become property of Co-Mo Connect Powered by Co-Mo Electric Cooperative and will not be returned.
- Five winners will be chosen to attend CYCLE Each finalist attending CYCLE will be given \$25 in spending cash. In the event of the trip to Jefferson City is cancelled, CYCLE winners will be gifted \$200 to use for school/college as recompense for the cancellation of the trip.
- The decision of the judges is final.
